A better understanding of land governance in Georgia

A new project funded by the European Union to support information and awareness about the land governance in the country.

The strong relationship between people and land supported by sound land governance are fundamental in achieving sustainable development. **Green Alternative** will carry out the two-and-a-half year project ***Improving land governance to foster sustainable agriculture development in Georgia***, which the European Union is supporting with a budget of € 150.000.

The project will:

- Promote the policy dialogue among civil society groups, public authorities and other stakeholders; and
- Improve the effectiveness of civil society groups' advocacy efforts.

By the end of the project:

- the relevant stakeholders are expected to have a better understanding of the land governance in the country, and have shared vision on future actions for a responsible land governance and a sustainable agriculture development in Georgia;
- there will be an increased awareness among major stakeholders about responsible land governance and sustainable agriculture development policies and practices;
- partnerships will be built between civil society groups and the reach of advocacy efforts will increase;
- land governance and agriculture development issues will be better covered in the media.
